

WISCONSIN PARENT FACT SHEET: PERSONAL READING PLANS

WHAT IS A PERSONAL READING PLAN (PRP)?

Implemented as part of Wisconsin 2023 Act 20, a Personal Reading Plan (PRP) is a school-based literacy intervention program designed for students in kindergarten through third grade who are reading below the 25th percentile. It aims to accelerate reading progress and close the achievement gap by providing targeted instruction and support to struggling readers.

WISCONSIN PUBLIC SCHOOLS ARE REQUIRED TO:

- Create a Personal Reading Plan (PRP) that clearly lists skill deficiencies, goals, weekly progress monitoring, science-based interventions and materials, and home strategies for parents.
- Provide parents with a copy of the plan and obtain a signature.
- **Monitor progress**: For kindergarteners this includes nonword and phoneme segmentation fluency; for grades 1st through 3rd, it includes oral reading fluency.
- Notify parents of progress after 10 weeks.

A plan is completed when parents and the school <u>both</u> <u>agree</u> that the goals are met, and the student is reading at grade level.

Fall: By the 3rd Friday of November

Other times: Within 10 days of assessment



FAMILIES CAN TAKE ACTION TO ENSURE COMPLIANCE

A complaint can be filed with the Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction against the school if the school is believed to not be following Personal Reading Plan requirements.

HOW TO FILE A COMPLAINT

- A parent of a 4K through third-grade student can file a complaint with DPI detailing how the school is not complying.
- If the school continues non-compliance after the department's notification, the complainant can take legal action in circuit court.
- A parent can seek a court order to stop the school from continuing non-compliant behavior or one that forces school compliance.
